






- One of the fiercest battles of the Second World War, the Battle of Kohima started on 4 April 1944, in which
  British and Indian troops fought against the Japanese offensive in the northeast of India.
- The Japanese were defeated which marked the beginning of the Allied push into Burma.
- In 1944, during the height of the <u>Second World War</u>, the Japanese planned an incursion into India via Burma.
   The plan was codenamed **Operation U Go**.
- The plan was to attack the northeast of India through Burma.
- . There was a British garrison at Kohima, today the capital of the state of Nagaland.
- The Japanese forces wished to attack the garrison and take Kohima after which they would take Assam and then march on to Delhi.
- · The battle is often referred to as the Stalingrad of the East.
- The British National Army Museum voted this battle as "Britain's Greatest Battle".
- Today, in the place where the tennis court of the Deputy Commissioner was, there is a war cemetery for the Allied dead. It has the famous Kohima Epitaph which reads,
- · "When you go home, tell them of us and say,
- · For your tomorrow, we gave our today"




